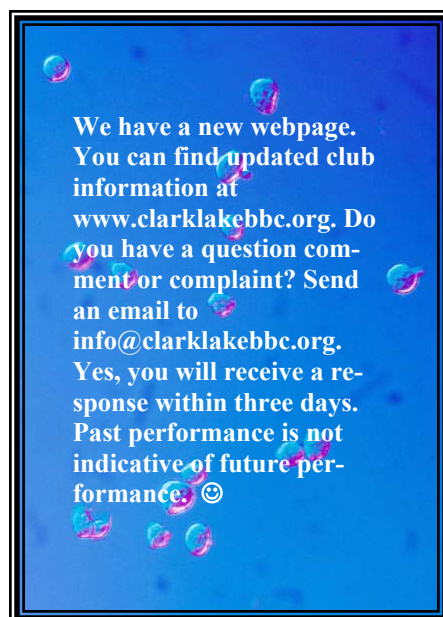
- Friday Night Café: Beginning June 17. Menus found on the website.

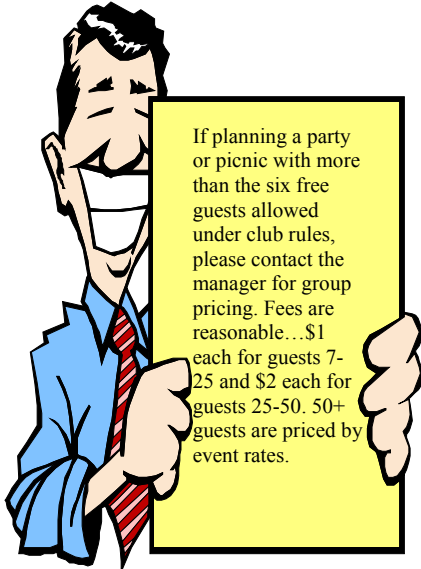

Important Membership Information



If planning a party or picnic with more than the six free guests allowed under club rules, please contact the manager for group pricing. Fees are reasonable...\$1 each for guests 7-25 and \$2 each for guests 25-50. 50+ guests are priced by event rates.

A priority this year will be to focus on measures to ensure that our members are given the value and use of the club they expect from their dues. We are increasing our attention on those visiting the club to insure they are members and/or legitimate guests of members. We owe this to our members.

As in the past an attendant will either greet members at the club gate or, when we have no attendant, members are expected to sign in at the clubhouse and indicate guests attending with

them.

Violations of membership and guest rules may be reported to the membership committee for review. Please comply with club rules that pertain to member attendance and guests including signing in when the gate is not attended. Instances where members attempt to circumvent rules by not signing in or accurately reporting their guest will automatically be reported to the membership committee.

Following is a review of membership criteria to enter the club and some options you might want to consider for those in your family who do not otherwise qualify as part of your membership. A membership includes the member,

member's spouse and dependent children (19 or under or a full-time college student). A member must be at least fifteen years of age to visit the club without an adult, and a member must remain at the club when their guest are visiting. Details on memberships and guest are available at the club. If you have a need for membership privileges for family members who do not meet these criteria, see the following options for Sponsored Membership.

New Membership Options

Sponsored Memberships: To meet the needs of those in your family who do not otherwise qualify to visit the club without you, we are offering some membership options to consider.

Young Adult Member: If your child is over 19 and not a full-time college student, but wants to use the Club as a member, we are offering a rider to your membership. For \$100, your adult child can be an individual member. A Young Adult membership is intended for single people and does not include a provision for spouse or children. The Young Adult membership allows two free guests/visit and a limit of two additional paid guests. The membership is available to individuals 25 years of

age or younger.

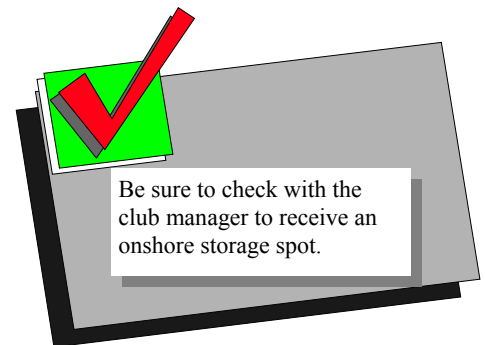
Legacy Memberships: Legacy Memberships give our current members the opportunity to sponsor memberships for their children or parents. Based on the years of your membership in the Club, the initiation fee for Legacy Memberships you sponsor will be discounted by \$50/yr. up to \$150. If you have been a member for one year, the initiation fee for those you sponsor will be \$150 (2yrs.- \$100, 3+yrs - \$50).

Young Family Membership: For individuals and families just starting out, we are offering a young family membership for those under 30 whereby the initia-

tion fee is waived until the member reaches 30 years of age, and \$30 per year of membership (up to \$150) will be credited toward the initiation fee when it becomes due. Tell a young family you know about this opportunity to join the Club with no upfront initiation fee.

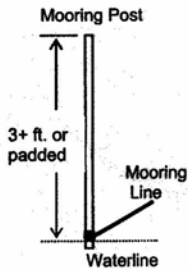

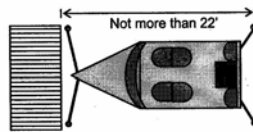
Boater Information

To protect mooring posts from damage, boaters using the Club- owned posts must secure the mooring line at the waterline (where there is the least leverage on the mooring posts), not at the



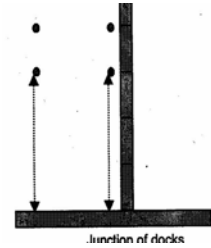
top. Posts, particularly the outer posts away from the dock must extend 3 ft. out of the water or be padded.

The outer posts shall not extend more than 22 ft. from the dock face. When placing your outer posts, use the



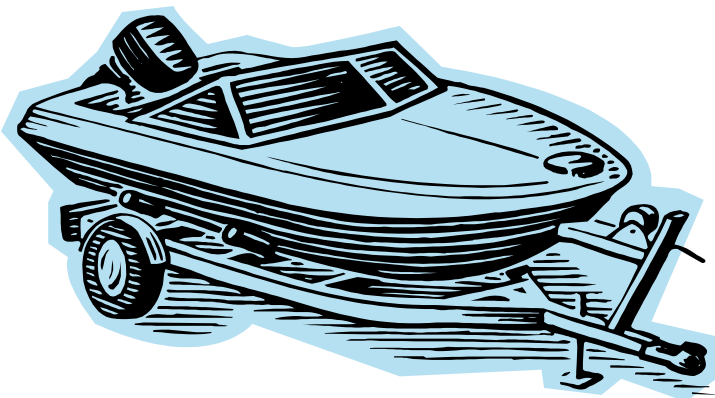
same distances as indicated by the slip marking on the dock.

Some slips are more than the respective 9' & 10' widths and therefore the outer posts can only be correctly positioned by using the same dimensions as on the dock.



Set the outer posts using the measured distance used for marking the slip on the dock.

Personal safety and the rights of other members is why the club has rules.

Clarklake Beach and Boat Club Rules Refresher

1. Guest Policies: Members must be present at all times for guests to be on grounds. Members are responsible for the conduct of their guests and must insure that guests observe all Club rules.

2. Alcoholic Beverages: The Club's liquor license and insurance forbid any alcoholic beverages not purchased from the Club to be on the grounds. This includes boats while moored in the marina. We are serious about the enforcement of this rule and violations by members (or their guests) will result in appropriate action being taken by the Board.

3. Other Rules

- An adult must accompany children under 15.
- No animals allowed.
- The pavilion cannot be "reserved". It can be rented with approval of the Club Manager.
- Chairs are limited, please do not take or hold more than you need. No chairs in the water.
- No smoking allowed on the beach.
- Change clothes in the bathhouse only. Vehicles are not permitted outside parking areas without approval of the Club Man-

ager.

4. General Philosophy: The Club places a great deal of emphasis on the personal safety and the rights of other members. Club management is empowered to ask members and guests to cease any activity deemed to be unsafe or an infringement on the rights of other members. The decision of club management is final unless or until reviewed by the Board of Trustees.
